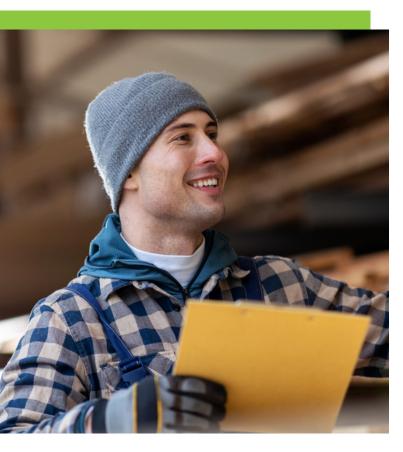

From health and safety hazards, data breaches and ethical issues, there are many risks that can threaten your financial health, reputation and wellbeing of your people and those you work with.

MODERN SLAVERY in supply chains and new measures by the government, announced in 2020, will hold businesses and public bodies more accountable than ever. Businesses will need to be even more transparent about the work they're doing to safeguard responsible practices, protect vulnerable workers and eradicate modern slavery risks.

A DATA BREACH risk involving just one of your suppliers can send security concerns down your entire chain and impact your business. If companies within your supply chain process personal data, you need to make sure that they're compliant and the data they collect is secure.

## A PRO-ACTIVE APPROACH TO CONTROLLING YOUR RISK AND VULNERABILITIES

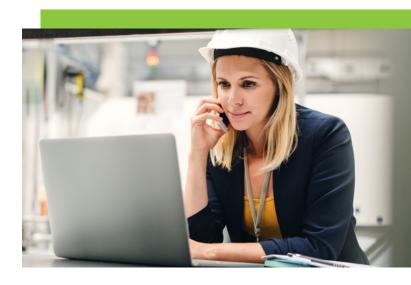
With many industries characterised by a large number of contractors and suppliers, one of the most challenging aspects is how to manage and source contractors and suppliers without compromising safety, sustainability, or ethics.

If the contractors you hire don't have a strong safety record, the right insurance, or strong risk management skills, they could end up costing your business money and worse, a fatality. If a supplier is using unethical practices, you could expose your business to reputational damage.

However, even in today's digital world, both procurement and EHSQ teams are managing their supply chains via paper-based systems and recording vast amounts of supplier and contractor assessment data within spreadsheets. Our research in 2020 found that two-thirds of businesses believe they're not realising the full potential of digital technology. 28% said it was essential, while 64% said it could be valuable, but don't use it much.

These manual processes often result in errors and duplication of effort and with nearly 90% of spreadsheets containing significant inaccuracies. 56% of EHS leaders report that software integration is their top purchase criteria when shopping for a new EHS system.

The small minority of companies that had invested in mapping their supply networks before COVID-19, have emerged better prepared with greater visibility into the structure of their supply chains. A robust approach to contract management helps to identify potential risks earlier and to address them before it is too late. The early and frequent adoption of digital technology will help businesses to do this.

Using technology means real time information, so your business knows exactly which suppliers and contractors are at risk. Software has the potential to offer flexibility and agility so that businesses have insight through reporting and analytics and visibility into all stages of the contract lifecycle.



### BEST PRACTICE TIPS FOR SUPPLY CHAIN COMPLIANCE

### PRE-QUALIFY CONTRACTORS AND SUPPLIERS

If you don't pre-qualify the contractors and suppliers you work with, either on your own or through a third party, you're potentially risking yourself to legal and financial implications. You should ideally assess safety statistics, regulatory compliance, financial stability, past performance and reputation as well as any necessary insurance and training requirements, so you have peace of mind that they're a good fit for the job.

#### 2 ADOPT A TECHNOLOGY-LED APPROACH

By adopting a technology-led approach and access to your data in one place, your entire organisation will have greater visibility when it comes to your supply chain. Managing suppliers is often complex and time consuming. By investing in a contractor or supply chain management system, you'll have the right support and effective management process in place. ### HAVE BACKUP SUPPLIERS

If one of your suppliers is unable to fulfil their role in your supply chain, it's your responsibility to make sure that if you prevent supply chain disruptions and delays by bringing alternative suppliers on board as quickly as possible. Identify suitable suppliers and carry out the same checks you would when choosing a primary supplier.

Alcumus e-permits is a leading web-based permit-to-work software system, automating processes including competence checks, scenario management, communication, clash checks and documentation, raising alerts when an issue needs to be resolved for work to proceed.

Where work is considered to be high risk, such as during construction projects, maintenance work, equipment installation and refurbishment, strict controls are required. The work must be carried out against previously agreed safety procedures known as a 'permit-to-work' system. The permit-to-work is a documented procedure that authorises certain people (who) to carry out specific work (what) within a specified time frame (when). It sets out the precautions required to complete the work safely (how), based on a risk assessment.
